Subject: -Grant of Conditional Permission to Indian Institute of Ayurvedic Medicine & Research, Bangalore Palace Compound, Jayamahar Road, Opp. Darga, Bangalore-560006, Karnataka (Inst.ID AYU0068) with 31 seats (Instead of 45 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 along with warning -regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Indian Institute of Ayurvedic Medicine & Research, Bangalore Palace Compound, Jayamahar Road, Opp. Darga, Bangalore-560006, Karnataka (Inst.ID AYU0068)** inspection of your College was conducted on **05.06.2023 & 06.06.2023** and revisited on **30.06.2023 & 01.07.2023 in Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional Permission with 45 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**

2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to the following shortcomings: -

1. **Teaching Staff:-**

a) Availability of total teaching staff after visitor observation $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{21}{30} \times 100\% = 67.8\%$ (Excluding Excess)

4. Functionality of the Hospital:-

- a) Total number of deliveries conducted in the last calendar year (i.e. 1st Jan 2021 - 31st Dec 2021) is **0. Labour room is found non functional**
- b) Total number of OPD is 06, **with shortcoming of Aatyayika (Casualty), Kaumarbhrittya- Balaroga, Prasuti & Stri Roga**

5. Observation by the visitors:-

- i.) OPD were Not functional. At the time of visitation not a single patient was present in OPD & IPD.
- ii.) Consultant physicians were not available in Atyayika, PTSR, KB OPDs.
- iii.) Registers show no data after 26/06/23 in many OPDs.
- iv.) Hospital was not functional.
- v.) Physiotherapy unit was not functional.
- vi.) Since April 2023 medicine indent record was not available.
- vii.) Ambulance facility is not available.
- viii.) Minor and major OT was not functional.
- ix.) Wards were not furnished and equipped enough to provide the standard health care.
- x.) No IPD admissions at the time of visit.
- xi.) Some patients are shown discharged on the morning of visit but the IPD wards and beds seem abandoned since a long time.
- xii.) Canteen was locked at the time of visitation.
- xiii.) Birth, Death, Diet, Anesthesia registers were not available.
- xiv.) Printers are not available in any department and Medical superintendent
- xv.) In many departments, not a single faculty was present at the time of visit.
- xvi.) Table and chairs are also not available for teaching staff in some departments.
- xvii.) Kriya sharira Lab was found in a pathetic condition and was not even equipped with the elementary amenities.
- xviii.) Dissection hall was not having enough space and tables.
- xix.) No patient were found in OPD and IPD during the time of visit.
- xx.) In most of the department not even a single faculty member was present during the initial phase of visitation.
- xxi.) There is a severe lack of practical and clinical exposure for the medical students enrolled to this institution. Some students shared this as a complaint confidentially.
- xxii.) Many discrepancies are noted while analyzing the attendance registers and they are found maintained carelessly.
- xxiii.) As per the data from registers, the hospital was found to be closed since last few days.
- xxiv.) No entries of patients were found in OPD registers.
- xxv.) OT and X-ray - found non-functional.
- xxvi.) Many faculties arrived late on the initial day or came on the second day and the authorities were not able to produce authentic data to substantiate the genuineness of their absence. Only few had proper leave letter submitted and others are considered as unauthorized absence.
- xxvii.) The students, staff and patients are not having enough hygienic washroom facility in the campus. Some girls raised this issue as a grievance (confidentially) while addressing the students.
 - a) Some teachers attendance were marked in the register and bio metrics even though they were absent on the day of visitation.

- 3.** In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **57th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **05.09.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no.** dated **16.09.2023** to appear on **19.09.2023** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with 45 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.**

- 4.** The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter ref no. IIAMR/INS/2023-2024/315 dated 17.09.2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Dr. Anupama Mutthige, Principal**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **19.09.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under: -

However, they were available later. Also, the principal stated that those faculty members attended the college signed the register and registered in biometric and went outside with prior permission. Submissions may be considered.

5. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 60th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 24.09.2023.**
6. WHEREAS, in view of the shortcoming and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college is not fulfilling the **basic eligibility criteria as mentioned in the hearing letter for issuance of conditional permission with 45 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24 along with the warning.**

*For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10 % of total intake capacity."*

*Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 60th Board meeting of MARBISM, **college is having only 24 total eligible Teaching faculties against the minimum requirement of 27 total eligible teaching faculties.***

*There is deficiency of 03 teachers for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10% of total intake capacity.***

*Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 31 seats (Instead of 45 seats)** under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.*

7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above and after applying the seat reduction policy, **Conditional permission is granted to Indian Institute of Ayurvedic Medicine & Research, Bangalore Palace Compound, Jayamahar Road, Opp. Darga, Bangalore-560006, Karnataka (Inst.ID AYU0068) with 31 seats (Instead of 45 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 along with warning to fulfill the following requirements: -**

A. Requirement:-

- I. All the infrastructure of your college and hospital should be restored after renovation and should be maintained as per MSR 2016 within 31st December 2023 and the compliance report is to be submitted.

B. Conditions :-

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.
- II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 31 seats (Instead of 45 seats)** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:
- All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
 - Requirement as mentioned above in Point 7 (A).
12. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 4th batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
13. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
14. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above along with the shortcoming mentioned in hearing Committee observation report may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
